He stated in the letter that

(quote)" the information I have on the Romines is very limited. My G-G-Grandfather (I think) was Matthew Maddox, Jr. He was born in 1783 in St. Mary's County, Maryland. He married Mary Romine (Romaine?) on September 3, 1807 in Harrison County, Virginia (West VA.) Mary's father was Samuel Romine.

I say I think Matthew, Jr and Mary were my g-g-grandparents because I've never been able to prove they were the parents of my g-grandfather Matthew R. Maddox born 1818 in Harrison County-but I feel that I'm right.

For what it is worth, there were a number of Romines in the Harrison Co (Clarksburg) and Wood County (Parkersburg) areas of what is now West Virginia. The 1860 Census lists Ville Romine, age 19, and Lloyd Romine, age 16. An Index to Harrison Co. Marriages lists 43 Romines. A list of Wood Co. cemetery inscriptions 10 Romines."(end of quote)
