I received a letter via U S Mail today from a Dale Romine. Below is a direct quote from his letter.

"My g-g-grandfather, Amos Romine, was in Fayette and Ross County area of Ohio about 1815. They moved to Tippecanoe County, Indiana where he died in 1838. Most of his children were born in Ohio. After Amos died, most of the family moved to Iroquois County, Illinois prior to 1840.
