You provided the following information -- which I find of special interest. This Giles is the brother of my ancestor gggrandfather, Daniel Nicholas Romine (born 11 November 1795 - died 3 April 1864, in Monroe Co. MI): I've decided to distribute this on the Romine List in case someone can benefit from it, correct it or expand on it.

A summary of this line follows to help keep the various Daniels & Nicholas straight:

- 3. Clas Romyn, of New Barbados, Bergen Co. NJ d:April 15 , 1785: Wife, Elisabeth Kip married 22 August 1746
- 4. Daniel Romine (1747?-1803), (husband of Deriky Demarest).
- 5. Nicholas (24 December 1773 15 January 1819 at Boonton, Morris Co. NJ), wife: Jane Mandeville  $\,$  -- the parents of Giles & 6. Daniel
- 6. Daniel Nicholas Romine (born 11 November 1795, Boonton NJ -died 3 April 1864, in Monroe Co. MI) wife: Sally Clark
- 7. John Romine (1830 Boonton NJ -1907) wife Julia Ann Fowler
- 8. John Wesley Romine (1862 MI -1848 MI) wife: Marilla McKay
- 9. Elvin McKay Romine (1896 MI -1976 MI) -- my father

Note this should be the son of the deceased Nicholas vice John -- as this record later states. This Nicholas (1773-1819) married Jane Mandeville 24 November 1794 in Pompton Plains, NJ. Their first child, my ancestor, Daniel Nicholas Romine was born 11 November 1795.

I believe this village is commonly spelled Parsippany -- it is just sw of the Jersey City Reservoir in Morris Co. NJ. Giles (18 Nov 1807-19 Oct 1888), his wife (Abby Young (7 May 1809-14 March 1884) and their two young daughters (Sarah 1833 - 1842 & Cornelia 1849 -1854), along with his father Nicholas (24 December 1773 - 15 January 1819 at Boonton, Morris Co. NJ), and Giles' sister Dorcas (b:12 May 1812, died unmarried 10 November 1866) are all cited on a common tombstone in Lower Montville DRC Cemetery near the dam that forms the reservoir.

Indicates Jane was still alive in 1855 - She is in the 1850 census as 75 years old. Have not found her in any 1860 census. Don't know what happened to her. She is not recorded on the tombstone with her husband cited above. Can anyone help identify where/when Jane Mandeville Romine died?

We had understood that his brother John Romine & John's wife, Ann Board, had moved to PA and then we lost them...perhaps we should look among the John Romines of NY. Giles had one other sister, Lydia/Leah, born 23 February 1801 -- she married Aaron Miller 24 April 1823 in Pompton Plains, NJ.

Giles, sometimes spelled Jiles, wife is also recorded as Abigail Young. It is correct that Giles had no living children in 1855 when this account was opened. I don't believe they no children after this date -- Abigail was 46 in 1855. The best references for this are Morris Co., NJ Wills # 1783N, abstracted in Lib D, Vol 394. Please note that H S Ackerman's book has the linage of this Nicholas somewhat confused -- HSA has skipped a generation in his book: This can be cleared up by referencing the Will of Daniel Romine (1747?-1803), (husband of Deriky Demarest). This Daniel Romine, then of Hanover Twp, Morris Co., died in 1803 and his will is abstracted in N.J. Archives Vol 39, Calendar of Wills Vol 10, years 1801-1805, p377. His father was a Clas (Nicholas) D. (Danielson) Romyn whose will is abstracted in the New Jersey Colonial Documents, p334. "April 15, 1785: Clas Romyn, of New Barbados, Bergen Co.: will of... Wife, Elizabeth, the house and lot where I now live, while my widow; said lot lies at Biese Pond. Son, Daniel, a large pewter dish, for his birthright;..." This wife is Elizabeth Kipp, I'm virtually certain, the daughter of Cornelius Kip & Eva Berdan. Klaas Romein and Elisabeth Kip married 22 August 1746, Bergen, Hackensack DRC. {Hackensack Church Marriage Records, New Jersey Archives (Mildred A McDonnell, pg26) says Klaas, Romein, y.m. and Elizabeth Kip, y.d. 1746, 7-6, that's July 6th, I believe} Elizabeth was reported to be a native of Preakness. Their children, baptized at Hackensack were (1) Daniel, baptized 2 August 1747...who I think is the Daniel who died in 1803 -- he would qualify for the large pewter dish...

I have included this additional material because it seemed like an opportunity to document this information -- and make note of the differences with the widely used HSAckerman publication. Any suggestions, corrections, clarifications would be appreciated.
