Hi Pat,

I have not seen a response to you go through the list but I do hope that some one was able to give you at least a little bit of information. Personally, I do not have a great deal of information beyond the names of the children of the first Thomas and a smattering on another of his sons, Abraham.

However, I would be greatly interested in knowing a bit more about your Thomas and whether or not you have ever found any evidence that either of them may have lived for a time (around 1790 and later) in Berkeley Co, VA. There is a Thomas Romine/Romans/ Ruming who appears in the records of Berkeley whom some Romine researchers have identified with identified with one or the other of the Thomas. There is also an Abraham Romine whose roots have not yet been identified present in Frederick Co, VA records which has given plausibility to the identification.

However, I doubt the identification. The primary reason is that the Abraham who is the son of Thomas I appears to have remained in the NY state area most of his life and to be well documented there. My records show that Thomas II was born in 1777 which would make him too young to be the father of the Abraham of Frederick Co, VA as that fellow married in 1800 but that is all the information that I have concerning him.

The upshot of it all is that I would greatly appreciate learning the dates for your Thomas II, the name of his wife and his children, if you are able to supply them. It would help to close some gaps in my records. Thanks for any information that you are able to send.
