He was possibly his son. The deed, which none of us actually has, has been reported to state that William was the "heir at law" of Samuel, an indication that he was Samuel's son and that Samuel died intestate.

A possible link that may be worth investigating is that William and Richard were witnesses to George Franciso's will on 26 April 1814. In his will, George mentions a wife name Mary and a daughter also named Mary but does not give her married name. A third witness to that will was Daniel Horton. A Mary "Remine" was a witness to Daniel's will in 1842 in Russell Co! Certainly this bunch seem to have known one another well enough, in light of the deeds that you mention...although, I don't suppose William was too happy with them for selling his place to collect on his debt! :)
