You mentioned Arnold Card in one of your e's. I knew that I had heard the name, so $\ensuremath{\mathrm{I}}$

asked my mother when I visited her today. She has a hard

time remembering recent things, but when I started going over

the Cards on the list you sent, she came up with all kinds of Card stories that T had

never heard before.

It seems that Arnold's mother, Aunt Ella, was especally nice to my mother when she

was a young girl. Ella made a dress for her that I could tell was still a special dress $\,$

even 75 years later. To a small girl being raised by her grandmother during hard times,

it was a special act of kindness.

She remembered Uncle George, and said Arnold Sr., had a son, Arnold, Jr. (Did she get

that right?) She also thought that Arnold Sr.'s wife, Betty Cox, had been in a women's

group at the Bloomingdale Methodist Church with her. She remembered Anna Eliz. Romain (Davidison) visiting her grandmother, Hattie Card.

She also remembered that Stephen Card and Aunt Kate raised Kate's niece, Sadie Peer

and that Israel Card and Aunt Lena didn't have any children either, but they raised my mother's good friend, Wilma Huber. She was also close to the children of Aunt Gus and Ed Reardon: Harry, Lester, Clarence, Doris, Unice, and John.

I never knew that her father, Norman Card had another family in Penn., six kids, two

being twins. I knew about my mother's half sisters, Anne and Ada, but that means Norman

Card fathered two sets of twins.

I would love to have copies of the pictures you mentioned. When you get the package I sent you, let me know which ones of the photocopies you would like a

regular photo of. By the way, all of the people in each generation that I $\mbox{\it am}$ sending you

now will are in the Romain History that is in the package.

Next generation:

Lambert Romain's great, great grandfather was Jan Janse Romeyn, AKA John Jansen Romeyn. He was Bapt. on Aug. 8, 1703 and died Sept. 10, 1785. His wife was Catrina "Catherine" Outwater. They

were married on Sept. 19, 1735 in Hackensack, NJ. They lived in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ. They had eight children:

- 2.) Jannetje "Jane" Romeyn b.1738 d. April 12, 1808. m. Abraham Ackerman. After the British pillaged the New Brunswick, NJ area during Rev. War, Abraham summitted a claim, under oath, of 55p-10s-8ps, for the loss of cattle, furniture, and clothing that were carried off by the British from his farm in South River, Middlesex County, NJ.
