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I was delighted to see your email when I went home earlier this week. Unfortunately the diskette was bad that I use to make my copy of the email on to bring with me so I am a bit slow in answering you.

You share some ancestors with a number of us on the mailing list so I do hope that you have signed up to be on the list.

I am descended from Abraham and Johannah thru their son Washington Romine and his wife, Catherine Foster. Our branch had sort of lost track of Levi Benoi and his family. As recently as the 1960's it was thought that Levi had gone to Oregon in about 1848/1850 after serving in the Mexican War. However, research that we did showed that some one in my family branch had confused Levi B with George Washington Romine, the son of David and Naomi Romine...and that George Washington had actually gone to what is now Washington State. Then my mother somehow made connection with Mary Kerr and Darlene Mann. I have corresponded with Mrs. Mann off and on for over a year now. She has most graciously been sending me information that she has on some of the descendents of Levi and I have been trying to get it all into the computer. :) I think that we are about half way thru the descendants of Levi!

In one letter that I had from Mrs. Mann, she mentioned that while many in the family in Iowa were interested in learning more about the family, there was only one nephew who might be interested enough to actually carry on doing research. Could that have been you? If so, I am delighted to have finally been able to make connections with you! Do you have the father of Abraham's wife? If not, I do have a bit of information on him. She was also a Romine.

Now for the bad news which someone may have alread sent to you. Abraham is not the son of Thomas Romeyn and Susannah Van Campen. That Abraham married Mary Maria Moore and died in 19 March 1838 in Galen, NY. So our Abraham's parentage is still untraced.

Am hoping to find another email from you when I get home to see what you might have on the wives of some of your Romine fellows. I have collected a goodly bunch of info on some of these folks and would be happy to share it with you.
