>Did we know about this ISAAC ROMINE being in the Kentucky Militia??  
>Which ISAAC is he?

The docs that you found are new to me. Most of the references that I have found so far to an Isaac Romine or Romaine in KY are later references and seem to actually be referring to Isaac Roman(s) who came to KY in abt 1797 according to his pension statement. He lived in the area of Jessamine Co. So this is clearly someone else.

This is the earliest mention of an Isaac Romine in KY that I have seen and may be the first references that we have found to Isaac Romine, the son of Peter and Abigail Romine of Loudoun Co, VA.

In the docs of that last court case, Peter Romine Jr. indicated that he had heard that Isaac had had at least one son but that the son too had died. The suit was being heard in 1803. The thought has occurred to me that this roughly matches what is known of the Peter Romine who married Catherin Cotner in KY in 1793. Both Peter and Catherine had died by the time their son Zachariah married in 1825 because Zachariah's grandfather, Frederick Cotner, gave permission for Zachariah to marry. By then the Cotners and their two Romine grandchildren were in Harrison Co, IN. Zachariah is estimated to have been born in about 1806. His father, Peter, is said to have been born in about 1772 in VA...but in 1772 Kentucky was a part of the state of VA, I think.

So it doesn't work really well at the moment because the dates aren't quiet right but it is something to start with. A lot more work needs to be done to sort out the Isaac Romaine/Roman references to see if they refer to one or two different people.
