William C. and Christopher are apparently one and the same.

Identifying this Peter and James is pretty tricky. The James who married Keziah can be proven to be in TN by 1812. Family lore would place his brother, Peter, and James both in the Front Royal area in VA until 1806 when Peter is said to have moved to Harrison Co and James to TN. Peter moves to Wood Co in 1812. So...it would seem that for awhile there were at least two Peters in Harrison Co.

The only James who is known to have lived there is the one who was married to Elizabeth Middleton. Right now there are several contenders to be his father: Thomas, Peter and Susannah of Fauquier, and my John Romine. My John is documented (by his will) to have had a son of the name. For Peter and Susannah, we can document that one of the Peters of Loudoun Co had a son of the name and I believe that circumstanstial evidence is strong for it to be the Peter & Susannah of Fauquier. For Thomas at the moment we have little early documentation.

Hope you can follow that.
