> Thanks for cc.ing me with the Kinble Info. you sent to Joan. Its great to finally  
> connect with someone else working on our line.

> Now I know why my mother can never keep her Card relatives straight, there are so many  
> of them and they are related to half the families of Bloomingdale. Before I send you  
> the next Romain generation, here are a couple of questions.  
>  
> 1.) Is the Charles O. Card line the only line of Cards in the Pompton area that you are  
> aware of? I'm wondering if all the Cards I have run across and heard about over the years could be from this one line. It seems possible, but probably  
> unlikely.  
>  
> 2.) Do you know if your Catherine M. Kimble had a sister Harriet who married Silas  
> Westervelt and had 19 children? Harriet, was born on May 04, 1817 in Newfoundland,  
> she died Feb. 01, 1876. Same era and location as Catherine. Seems likely.  
>  
> 3.) Have you invested in the genealogical software that you mentioned yet? Joan and I  
> have the Family Tree Maker Version #4. Everyone has their own favorite, I think  
> FTM works great. It does everything I want it to do. The "book" I sent you was made  
> with the FTM.  
>  
> In reply to your question to Joan about Charles Card's (JR.'s) middle name, I have never  
> seen any name or initial or any mention of his parents. We will have to use a search of  
> the wills like we did for the Romans.  
>  
> You mentioned Charles O. living on Matthews Ave. I grew up on Union Ave. You might  
> remember my dad's saw sharpening shop, a few blocks in from Main St. (Hamburg Typke.)  
>  
> Lambert Romain's great grandfather was Nicholas Janse Romeyn, AKA Nicholas Janse Romine,  
> AKA Claes (Nicholas in Dutch) Janse Romeyn.  
>

> Nicholas was born in Hackensack and Bapt. on Nov. 29, 1741, he died in 1831 in Pompton.  
> We don't know his wife's name. (CAN ANYONE ON THE ROMINE LIST HELP US WITH THIS ONE?)  
> He had six children:  
>  
> 1.) David N. Romine (Romeyn) (1761--1826) He is buried in the Crooked Pond Cemetery.  
> He married Jannetje "Jane" Vander Beek. He was living in Franklin Township in 1824.  
> They had four children:  
>  
> 1.) Jane Romine married Harman Baker on Nov.11, 1826 at the Wyckoff Ref.  
> Church. Her second husband was David Storms, m. April 07, 1832 at  
> The Ponds, now Oakland, NJ.  
>  
> 2.) John D. Romine (Romaine) was born on June 01, 1794 in Totowa, NJ.  
>  
> 3.) Sarah Romine (Romeyn) was born on March 19, 1796 in Totowa, NJ. She  
> married Isaac S. Jaques on Sept. 03, 1814 in New York City.  
>  
> 4.) Abraham D. Romine (Romaine) was born in 1800 and died Oct. 10, 1865.  
> He is buried in the Wyckoff Ref. Ch. Cemetery.  
>  
> 2.) John N. Romine-Grandfather of Lambert Romain  
>  
> 3.) Nicholas Romine, AKA Nicasie Romaine b.Abt. 1768 d. 1821. His first wife is  
> Unknown, but on July 29, 1797 he married Sarah "Sally Cool (Cole) in Newfoundland,  
> NJ. They had six children:  
>  
> 1.) Elizabeth Romine (Dec. 08, 1798--Sept. 13, 1854)  
>  
> 2.) Jacob Romine (Nov. 07, 1801--Jan. 21, 1873)  
>  
> 3.) Sarah Romine b. Aug. 18, 1803 m. William E. Folly  
> Jan. 31, 1824  
>  
> 4.) Nicholas N. Romine (May 20, 1805--Sept. 13, 1875)  
>  
> 5.) Abraham Cole Romine b. Dec. 23, 1809  
>  
> 6.) Antje Romine (Roumaine) b. Sept 27, 1812 m. Jacob  
> Henry Fink on May 30, 1838 in Brooklyn, NY. m. (2)  
> Michael Wygant on  
> Sept. 14, 1862 in Hackensack, NJ  
>  
> 4.) Catherine "Caty" Romine (Feb.26, 1770 -- April 09, 1844) died in Oakland (The  
> Ponds) and is buried in the Van Houten Cemetery. She married John L.  
> Ackerman in  
> 1791. Family tradition says John was a farmer who also ran a saw  
> mill. It is said  
> that he was a Rev. War Vet and was with Washington at Valley Forge.  
> They had four  
> children:  
>  
> 1.) Lawrence Ackerman  
>  
> 2.) Nicholas Ackerman b. Jan. 24, 1795 at Crystal Lake,  
> NJ  
>  
> 3.) James J. Ackerman b. May 11, 1802  
>  
> 4.) Thomas Ackerman b. Sept. 17, 1803 in Wyckoff, NJ  
>  
>  
> 5.) Sarah Romine b.Abt 1771 d.Oct. 30, 1848. was living in New York City  
> at the time  
> of her death. She married John Van Rypen. They had two children:

> 1.) John Van Rypen, Jr. b. Feb. 15, 1792 in  
> Acquackanonk, NJ

> 2.) Nicholas Van Rypen b. Feb. 20, 1794, Bapt. Totowa  
Ref. Ch.

> 6.) Margaret Romine b. Abt. 1772. She married Peter Traphagen. They had  
three children:

> 1.) Maria Traphagen b. Oct. 08, 1820 in NYC  
>  
> 2.) William Traphagen b. Feb. 26, 1823 in NYC  
>  
> 3.) Margaret traphagen b. Jan. 02, 1826 in NYC
